MEANS OF EGRESS DOORWAYS

A question has arisen concerning the application of section 1017.0. In previous editions of the OBBC, this section applied to "...all doorways serving as a component or element of a means of egress *from habitable and occupiable rooms...*" (See old section 813.1) which meant that toilet room doorways were excluded.

However, in current section 1017.1 OBBC, "*habitable and occupiable rooms*" has been deleted. As a result, this section now requires compliance for *all* doorways serving as a component or element of a means of egress. Doorways, such as those serving toilet rooms within use group R-I guest rooms, for example, would be required to comply.

This change was specifically intended by code change B112-91 to cover *all* means of egress doorways, not just doorways from habitable and occupiable rooms which, by definition, excluded many areas of a building that should have been regulated. This also coincided with a 1990 report from the CABO Board for the Coordination of the Model Codes (BCMC) recommending that code provisions should protect *all* occupants *including* those with physical disabilities.

A related question arises: If toilet room doors are required to comply, why not doors to closets or similar spaces? In applying this section, the building official must determine whether or not a room is *designed* for the entrance, use and exiting of human occupants. This is typically not the case for doorways to small closets and other such spaces.
