

I am a real estate salesperson in a state that has a reciprocal agreement with Ohio. How can I obtain an Ohio real estate salesperson's license?

The Ohio Division of Real Estate and Professional Licensing has reciprocity agreements with the following states: ***Arkansas, Colorado, Connecticut, Mississippi, Nebraska, Oklahoma, West Virginia and Wyoming.***

Qualifications for an Ohio Salesperson Reciprocal License:

1. Be a resident of a state that has a reciprocal agreement with Ohio.
2. Hold an active salesperson's license in that state for at least one year preceding the filing of the application.
3. Take an Ohio Real Estate Law Course at an institution of higher education.
4. Be affiliated with an Ohio licensed broker.

An applicant for an Ohio salesperson's license should submit:

1. A [Salesperson Reciprocity Application](#) with \$60.00 fee.
2. A [Consent to Service of Process](#) form.
3. A letter of good standing from the state of licensure.
4. Proof of completion of the Ohio Real Estate Law pre-licensure course.

When the Division receives a complete application, the applicant's information will be sent to the testing vendor. The testing vendor will process the information and send a Candidate Information Bulletin with instructions on scheduling the test.

The applicant must pass the State portion of the Ohio Real Estate Salesperson exam in order for a license to be issued. Passing score: 70
